Throughout, I've been ensuring local feedback has been heard by Ministers,

I wholly support forging new free trade deals with countries around the world, which will help to boost our business with existing and emerging markets, whilst protecting our food and farming standards, and of course, our precious NHS, which will not be included in any future agreements. We also have a new, common sense, skills-based immigration system instead of EU free-movement - this means that, going forward, our immigration system will provide better control, but also be much fairer, treating people equally, regardless of where they come from in the world. We also struck a very good comprehensive free trade agreement with the EU in December – ensuring a smooth and orderly departure and one that delivers on the commitments we made in full. SECURING MORE FUNDING FOR LOCAL SERVICES

MAKING SURE CORBY GETS A BIG 'TOWN DEALS' BOOST

As part of the Government's new 'Town Deals' initiative, where communities with industrial heritage can access grants of up to £25 million for regeneration projects, I fought hard to secure Corby's inclusion. Now we have been successful, our bid has been drawn up and submitted, including plans for a new sixth form college in the town centre, a new community, youth and arts space, retirement flats and cycling and walking infrastructure improvements. I hope our bid will succeed and come to fruition, having incorporated local feedback and suggestions from residents. This is a great opportunity to bring forward the next chapter in Corby's regeneration story - something I am extremely excited about and we also recently secured an extra £750,000 to get various smaller projects underway immediately. ●



A SNAPSHOT OF OTHER KEY CAMPAIGNS

- 1 I successfully campaigned for the funding for the repairs to the North Bridge in Oundle, which are now complete.
- 2 I believe we can all do our bit to help improve our local, national and international environment and have been pressing both locally and nationally for more robust action on the blight that is litter and fly-tipping.
- 3 I have supported many local planning objections across Corby & East Northamptonshire, fighting against unwanted overdevelopment and maintaining that where homes are built, they should command community support and that the character of our rural towns and villages must be preserved.

- 4 I believe that when people buy new homes, the quality of them should be second to none and I am supporting residents on a case-by-case basis to ensure their dream new home is exactly that.
- 5 I continue to actively support local people in opposing unwanted waste plant proposals in Corby.
- 6 I always have, and always will, work cross-party to champion UK steel production, of which we are rightly enormously proud here in Corby. The industry is strategically vital and I work closely with its leaders, the unions and relevant ministers to keep its future strong and secure.

- 7 I am delighted the Chowns Mill Roundabout works are now underway, and the works to rebuild the Leyland Bridge near Irthlingborough are now completed, both of which I pressed hard to make happen.
- 8 I actively supported the building of the new first-class Enterprise Centre in Raunds, which is an important boost for local jobs and the growth of many small businesses.
- 9 I held our first Apprenticeships Fair, which was well attended and showcased the wealth of opportunities for our young people. It's an initiative I am keen to extend and I have exciting plans for the coming year. I was also delighted to hold a very successful lifestyle event for the over 50s.

- 10 I am continuing to make the case for a safe crossing over the A43 between Priors Hall and Weldon.
- 11 I have been campaigning for improved rail services to and from Corby, both north and southbound, with real success. Work on the electrification is now finished and services to and from London are going from hourly to half-hourly from May – a big investment and improvement.
- 12 I held my weekly advice surgeries in both Corby and across East Northamptonshire during the year, and over the telephone during periods of tighter restrictions.
