**RE: VOTER IDENTIFICATION.**

Thank you for your recent correspondence in respect of your concerns regarding voter identification. I have read your comments with interest.

A secure electoral system is a vital component of a healthy democracy, and the public must have confidence that our elections are secure and fit for the 21st Century. Asking voters to bring ID to their polling station is an important way of achieving this and the *Electoral Integrity Bill* will put such a requirement into law.

Voter ID is, however, not new. Northern Ireland has required paper ID at polling stations since 1985, and photo ID since 2003 – which was introduced by the last Labour Government. It has proved to be effective at tackling fraud and I have been assured that it has not curtailed election turnout.

Identification to vote has been backed by the Electoral Commission and the Organisation for Security & Co-operation in Europe's Office for Democratic Institutions & Human Rights, which state that its absence is a security risk. At present, it is harder to take out a library book, or collect a parcel at a post office, than it is to vote in someone else's name.

In pilot schemes in 2018 and 2019, the overwhelming majority of people cast their vote without a problem and the success of the pilots proves that this is a reasonable and proportionate measure to take, and there was no notable adverse effect on turnout.

The Electoral Commission has also stated that *"the experience of taking part in the pilot scheme appears to have had a positive impact on people's perception of the security of the polling station process, and on their confidence in it...Polling station staff were satisfied with how polling day went and were confident that they could manage the process of people showing voter identification at future elections."*

I am assured that, under the Government's proposals, anyone without an ID will be able to apply for a new free one – meaning that no voter will be disenfranchised, which is of paramount importance.
